Dr. Dugan is a current member of the American Counseling Association, the International Association of Play Therapy, and many other professional organizations in the field. She has served on several committees and most recently serves as the Past President of the Louisiana Branch of the Association of Play Therapy.

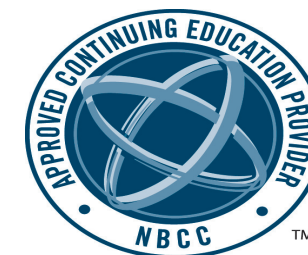
